Denton Toastmasters Receive Special Recognition

Denton Toastmaster Club received special recognition for two members from District 25 Governor David Himmelstein for earning DTM status. Bob Seiple and Alexis Sutterfield were presented with their DTM Award by Governor Himmelstein at Monday's meeting of the Denton Toastmasters Club.

Although Seiple and Sutterfield initially received their awards at a special District 25 Awards Banquet in Dallas on May 6, Himmelstein made the special recognition as it is unusual for any club to have multiple members becoming Distinguished at the same time. Less than one percent of all Toastmasters have been recognized as Distinguished Toastmasters.

Governor Himmelstein noted it is highly unusual for a club as small as the Denton Toastmasters Club (which has only 16 members) to have so many Distinguished Toastmasters (Seiple and Sutterfield bring the number up to five). Having that many DTMs in a small club allows new members to be nurtured in their public speaking skills by a number of highly experienced and knowledgeable mentors.

The Denton Toastmasters Club meets from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. on Mondays at the Lake Forest Good Samaritan Village, which is located at 3901 Montecito in Denton, Texas. Additional information is available at

Dr. Albert Schweitzer was one of the most famous missionaries of the modern era. Leaving behind both an academic career (he had a Ph.D. in both theology and physics) and a concert career (he was also a renowned concert organist) he set up a medical clinic in French Equatorial Africa.

When he was 85 years old Schweitzer and some others were walking up a hill. It was extremely hot. Suddenly Schweitzer walked away from the group and made his way toward an African woman struggling up the hill with a large load of wood. He took the wood from the woman and carried it up the hill for her.
